LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



You probably didn't know that at MountainStar, we combat child abuse and neglect with glitter - glitter paint, glitter pens, and glitter powder - it's everywhere! Okay, it's not really the glitter that makes a difference; it is the relationships that get built when children come to MountainStar.

We look and feel like a high-quality early learning center, but there are extra elements that make our classes "therapeutic." High staff to child ratio, a trauma-informed approach, staff trained in infant/toddler mental health,

and the overarching goals of social/emotional development and building resilience are what sets us apart.

There is nothing scarier than a family with young children who face multiple challenges especially when they don't have a network of positive relationships. Big family problems, young children, and social isolation are a dangerous combination and that is where MountainStar steps in to help.

Parents and children enrolled at MountainStar benefit from the encouragement and support provided by staff and volunteers. They are more likely to meet developmental milestones, make progress on family goals, or simply enjoy a moment with glitter, glue, and a piece of paper. A recent study conducted by the data analytics team at the Oregon Department of Human Services confirms that children enrolled in Relief Nursery services, like MountainStar, stay safe despite their elevated risk for involvement with Child Welfare.

Local community support ensures MountainStar continues to serve close to 300 children and their families across Central Oregon. With your help, that number will continue to grow, especially as we work to create a new center in Redmond by April 2020. Thanks to the generous donors at our Birdies 4 Babies event this year, we have purchased a "new" used bus to transport children to our classrooms every day.

MountainStar is committed to improving outcomes for families with young children who live with overwhelming stress. As the need grows, so will our services. Please know that your involvement as donors, volunteers, and advocates is what allows our services to remain free and responsive to those families in need.

Thank you for believing in us, thank you for your partnership, and thank you for caring about our community's youngest children.

SPOTLIGHTS

“LOLA’S” STORY

At 10 months old, "Lola's" mom no longer recognized her.

Lola's parents were in a severe car accident when she was just 10 months old. Both survived, but it was Lola's mom who suffered brain injuries. Her speech was affected, and she had extreme memory loss. She no longer recognized her daughter and could not provide the affection that Lola desperately needed. Lola's dad lost his job trying to balance the full-time care for his wife, and they soon ended up homeless.

Then MountainStar entered their lives. Our interventionists stood with them as the family was forced to adjust to their new reality. We provided as many resources as possible - diapers, food boxes, gas cards, grocery gift cards - and embraced Lola, surrounding her with love to help heal the neglect she had experienced. As of today, Lola's mom has regained her memory and speech. Lola's father found steady work and safe housing for their family. And Lola is doing great. You can find her at MountainStar dancing in circles.

She loves music, playing with instruments, and engaging with her peers.

SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING

When MountainStar talks about therapeutic classes, it means social and emotional learning. For children, the trauma they experience can be debilitating, causing an inability to create healthy bonds with family members and others they encounter. With this understanding, MountainStar focuses on a child's ability to build healthy relationships; and it is important that we monitor and measure each child's progress. We look at the interaction between a child and his peers, volunteers, and staff and how those relationships change over time. We also observe a child's ability to self-regulate and their overall emotional state, using activities that allow for an exploration of feelings with some very simple guidance.

Art is one of the best mediums available for children. We provide ample opportunity for self-directed art, but we also guide that process, suggesting children paint a picture of their family, something that is scary, or how the children felt with the recent loss of their class fish. With your help, MountainStar is able to provide a space that supports the emotional spectrum of a child's experiences, knowing that many children have some big feelings they need help processing.

"SAM'S" STORY

"Sam" struggled in a shifting household and inconsistent care.

Sam's home environment was extremely unstable. He was cared for by his dad and stepmom, with his mom out of the picture struggling with addiction. His father worked multiple jobs and his stepmother was raising three other children. Sam was getting lost in the mix and began having trouble regulating his emotions and setting boundaries. When his dad and stepmom separated, things got even harder. Fortunately, Sam's mom was in full recovery and he was able to move in with her. Despite this positive transition, Sam still struggled.

When Sam arrived at MountainStar, interventionists immediately responded by setting clear boundaries and working on breathing exercises to help regulate his emotions. Sam's mom was referred to mental health services, coaching her on techniques to support Sam's behavior. Sam's mom immediately recognized the impact of MountainStar's program and started to increase her involvement in home visits and at family nights. Over the past year, Sam has gone through incredible change. He has become a helper in class, self-regulates, and is better prepared for kindergarten.

Gloria Lopez-Davis Infant Program Endowment

MountainStar mourns the loss of Gloria Lopez-Davis, a true friend and champion of vulnerable families in our community. Gloria provided incredible support to MountainStar, serving on the advisory board, governing board, and two terms as board president. Her leadership, commitment, and guidance propelled MountainStar forward, ensuring our services grew and reached those families most in need. In 2013, Carl Davis made a \$50,000 endowment gift to honor his wife, reflecting Gloria's passion for helping children.

"All children are a gift to be cherished. No child - regardless of the circumstances of their birth or the harsh reality of their home environment - deserves to be neglected or abused. It is clear and certain that programs that focus on prevention with the youngest and the most vulnerable are the most successful, because they truly work. ...It is my fondest hope that many others in our community will join me in cherishing these young children and their parents," said Gloria.

The endowment remains an inspiration for MountainStar and has grown to \$125,594. We acknowledge and thank those who joined with Gloria and embraced our community's children.




